Small State Foreign Policy: Taking Leadership in International Diplomacy

The University of Copenhagen offers a week-long intensive summer course, sponsored by the Erasmus+ project Leadership in Small States (LIST).

- The 2020 Copenhagen Summer School is the final intensive programme organized by this partnership. The summer school runs under the heading "Small State Foreign Policy: Taking Leadership in International Diplomacy"
- The course brings together many of the leading scholars in the field
- The course is open to Master's and Ph.D. students. Allocation of credits is in line with students' home university's rules and procedures.
- Travel and accommodation is covered by the grant from Erasmus+
- The course counts as 7,5 ECTS credits

Application process:

Students from the partner universities must apply directly through their own universities. Each partner university nominates up to three students to participate in the program based on a competitive selection process. Students can apply by sending a transcript and a motivational letter to their university's contact person. University of Copenhagen students will be allocated to the course through the regular course allocation procedure for Master's level courses at the Department of Political Science and should follow the regular deadlines of this allocation procedure.
